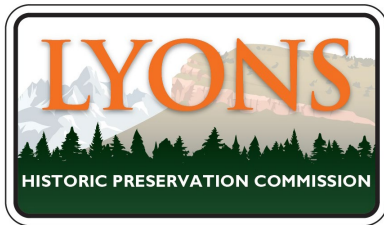


MINUTES HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION MEETING FEBRUARY 10, 2021

- 1
2 **1) Call to Order**
3 The Town of Lyons Historic Preservation Commission was called to order on Wednesday,
4 February 10, 2021, at 5:33.
- 5 **2) Roll Call**
6 Commissioners: Lauren Click, Priscilla Cohan, Mike Donohoe, Brianna Hoyt
7 Staff: Reyana Jones
8 Trustee Liaison: Hollie Rogin
9 Guests: None
- 10 **3) Approval of Agenda**
11 Commissioner Click made a motion to approve the Agenda, and it passed unanimously.
- 12 **4) Approval of Previous Meeting's Minutes**
13 Commissioner Hoyt made a motion to approve the December meeting minutes, and it passed
14 unanimously.
- 15 **5) Reports**
16 **a) Audience Business (Limited to 15 minutes - All comments will be limited to 4 minutes**
17 **per person)**
18 There were no audience members in attendance.
- 19 **b) Trustee Report**
20 Trustee Rogin did not have anything to report, but was happy about the joint meeting
21 with PCDC and is looking forward to the workshop with the Board of Trustees.
- 22 **c) Staff Report**
23 Yani Jones gave a training/presentation to Commissioners on heritage interpretation to
24 help them with their walking tour project.
- 25 **6) Regular Agenda**
26 **a) Joint HPC/PCDC Meeting Debrief**
27 Commissioner Hoyt agreed to be the liaison to the PCDC. Commissioners approved of the
28 changes to the draft ordinance based on the joint PCDC/HPC meeting. There was also some
29 discussion on the process regarding when to send the ordinance to the Town Attorney; Staff
30 will send the draft prior to the workshop with the Board of Trustees to allow time for his
31 review.
- 32 **b) Walking Tour**
33 Commissioners shared that everyone is still working on their entries for the walking tour, and
34 they asked each other questions related to content and shared things they have discovered,
35 such as information on KKK history or specific sites like Rogers Hall. Also discussed were topics
36 like citation format. They set a new deadline for themselves for writing the walking tour entries
37 as the March HPC meeting, with editing and beginning of formatting taking place for prior to the
38 April meeting, and presentation of the final tour (print and digital) for Historic Preservation
39 Month in May. They also plan to upload their walking tour entries to a shared folder where they
40 can read over each other's work and work on editing. Trustee Rogin suggested putting together
41 a little list of "scandals" for use in the future as research uncovers them.

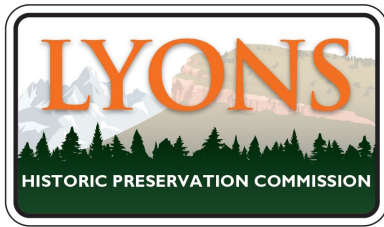

42 c) Historic Preservation Month
43 Commissioners discussed ideas for Historic Preservation Month. Commissioner Click
44 recommended doing guided walking tours or a “scandal tour.” Vice Chair Cohan suggested
45 doing a weekly guided tour event on Sunday afternoons in May, perhaps, and they could be
46 ticketed to keep group sizes down, if necessary. She also recommended that the Commission
47 should meet to do the tour together too, and others agreed. Commissioner Click noted that if
48 we have a budget, we should pay the tour guide to support local historians (e.g. Barney
49 Dreistadt, possibly, or Museum staff). She also mentioned an idea for the future of creating
50 photo viewer stations, like those used to view old Yankee Stadium; Commissioner Hoyt added
51 that Museum staff has considered doing a then-and-now photography project, and she thinks the
52 Museum would happily partner with the HPC on this. Trustee Rogin thought perhaps a special
53 tour for kids would be a complementary activity. Commissioner Hoyt commented that Museum
54 staff might be open to helping with tours, especially if they can also collect donations for the
55 Museum at the same time, and she also noted that coming up with an outline to share with the
56 Museum regarding the tours to gain their partnership would be helpful. Commissioner Hoyt
57 asked Staff for additional information on indigenous persons in the area and archaeological sites
58 for a potential archaeologically themed workshop for May. Trustee Rogin asked about
59 reestablishing connections with tribes that inhabited the Lyons area, and Commissioner Click
60 discussed some work to restore a trail marker being pursued by the LAHC that involves
61 collaboration with the Ute tribe, and she will keep the commission updated.
